
The Phrase

A phrase is a musical sentence or idea. It usually is shown by a phrase mark. A phrase mark looks the same as a slur.





- Say each tongue twister aloud three times for fun.

 - Draw phrase marks. Then play!




Tongue Twister: Two toads totally tired.

Can you transpose this to the C 5-finger scale?




Look out for this one!
