
## The Key Signature


**Review:** The G major scale has an F<sup>#</sup>.

New: A piece in the key of G major will also use F#, instead of a "plain F." A sharp is not written before every F. Instead, an F# is shown at the

beginning of each staff. This is called the key signature.




These sharps mean to play all F's as F#.
